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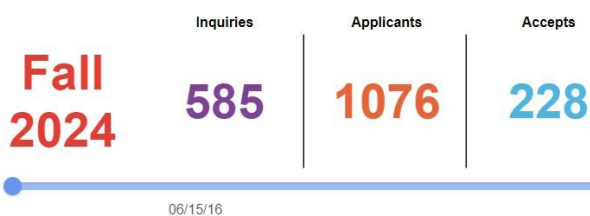

Application submissions for Fall 2024 are higher compared to last Fall's submissions. Access and Enrollment Services (ACES) is in the process of completing the application acceptance. For the Fall semester, ACES will be focusing on updating pages on its website, starting with Advancement

and Admissions. ACES plans to launch a virtual tour experience by the end of the Spring semester. The ACES team will also work on building new communication plans for prospective students and improving the application experience.

Personnel

In October 2023, ***Shaquille Richardson*** was hired as Director of Sports Information and Facilities for the Athletics Department. Mr. Richardson oversees the department's media requests, website administration, social media strategy and execution, and gameday facilities management at the Elridge Blake Sports & Fitness Center. He joined UVI after working as a teacher for the Department of Education in the Virgin Islands from 2017 to 2023. In addition, he has extensive expertise in sports media, having worked as a journalist, analyst, and statistician for Livewire Sports, a St. Thomas, U.S.V.I.-based sports media company, since 2019.

Unit Achievements and Activities

Academic Units

All graduates from the School of Nursing, Albert A. Sheen Class of 2023, passed the NCLEX-RN examination on the first sitting as of December 2023

Ten students in the Bachelor of Science Nursing program traveled to Bradford, Massachusetts, from October 22, 2023, to November 1, 2023, to complete clinical rotations at the Whitter Rehabilitation Hospital. Mr. Brian Costa and Mrs. Patricia Burks, Assistant Professors, escorted the students. Greenleaf VI provided funding for this project through the Office of Institutional Advancement. The Office of the Provost and the School of Nursing faculty facilitated this endeavor's success.

After receiving accreditation, the School of Education sent its first annual reports to the Association for Advancing Quality in Educator Preparation (AAQEP). The academic unit created three quality assurance reports (QARs) and self-studies and presented them to the accrediting authority in three reports. The teacher education program report was prepared under the leadership of the Dean, Dr. Karen Brown. Program directors, ***Dr. Xuri Allen and Dr. Clinton Valley***, oversaw the development of the reports for their respective graduate programs in School Counseling and Educational Leadership.

In August and September of 2023, the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences' Caribbean Writer Press had several successes. The 175th Anniversary Emancipation Committee approached the Caribbean Writer Press to advise them on publication for their "Call for Papers." The press was commissioned to publish the call's outcome, an assortment of academic papers, essays, poetry, and fiction. Additionally, poet Daisy Holder-Lafond has requested that the Caribbean Writer Press publish her book of poems, "We Who Owned Nothing," which focuses on the history and culture

of the Virgin Islands. The Caribbean Writer Press was invited in September 2023 to write a creative article about the climb on Maroon Ridge. Olassée Davis of the School of Agriculture led the trip.

The College of Science and Mathematics approved a new minor in Biology that is now under review by the University's Curriculum Committee. The minor will allow students in related fields, such as chemistry and psychology, to complement their learning.

On November 7, 2023, the School of Business held a hybrid meeting to relaunch its advisory committee program. In-person attendees included the president of the U.S. Virgin Islands Hotel and Tourism Association, the general manager of the Ritz-Carlton St. Thomas, and FDIC officials. Virtual attendees included the Director of the Virgin Islands Bureau of Internal Revenue, Merck's Global Diversity and Inclusion Center of Excellence vice president, the SEC representative, and the dean of Howard University's School of Business.

Athletics

On October 21, 2023, the UVI Men's and Women's cross-country teams wrapped up their seasons by participating in their first-ever Gulf Coast Athletic Conference championship competition. The men's team finished 7th overall, led by **Nasir Watson**, who finished the 8K race in 35:17.5. **Ariana Renault**, competing for the ladies, finished the 6K race in 11th place with a time of 29:15.45, narrowly missing the podium.

On November 3, 2023, the Athletics Department hosted its first Buccaneer Madness event. The basketball teams were introduced to the public and played in scrimmages. There were three-point shooting and dunk contests, interactive games with fans for prizes, and other giveaways for attendees. Over 200 people attended the fun-filled event.

Between November and December 2023, eight home basketball games were held, including six for the men's team and two for the women's team. The men played an exhibition game during the 24th annual Paradise Jam.

VI EPSCoR

The National Science Foundation (NSF) was invited and sponsored by VI-EPSCoR for a workshop on the Virgin Islands Reef Resilience Study (VIRRS) on September 27–29 and November 3–4, 2023. The workshop's objectives were to define resilience, identify critical factors, develop metrics for assessing resilience, and specify conservation goals for USVI reefs. Fifty-one topic area experts were invited to the session, which was attended by invitation only.

On December 7, 2023, VI-EPSCoR conducted a Governance Committee meeting and presented the first draft of the Science and Technology Plan for review and feedback by the committee.

Eastern Caribbean Center

In order to examine data gathered in 2022–2023 from visitors arriving in the USVI on cruise ships and flights during the low and high tourist seasons, the Eastern Caribbean Center (ECC) signed a contract with the Bureau of Economic Research.

The ECC appeared on NPR Analyze This and WSTA Pass it On, two popular radio talk shows, to discuss USVI's most recent demographic and housing statistics. The ECC theoretical archetype of the migrating VI population (paper in process) was also discussed.

Other

The UVI Passport to the World Travel Learning Program traveled to Panama and Colombia. Understanding the Panama Canal's function and the impact of Caribbean people was the main goal of the initiative. Ten undergraduate students were among the party of 27 who visited the Mira Flores Locks in Panama to get a close-up look at the facility. In addition, they went to the Afro-Antillean Museum to discover more about the links that bind Panama to the Caribbean region and had an opportunity to interact with members of the Embera people, an indigenous community that lives semi-nomadically. The party traveled to Boquillas in Cartagena, Colombia, which is mostly an Afro-Colombian neighborhood. One of the visit's activities was a mangrove excursion.

Grants, Donations, and Special Projects Funded

The Eastern Caribbean Center applied for and received the Street Addressing Initiative contract from the Lt. Governor's Office with sub-contractor Spatial Focus for \$1,999,089. Currently, contracts are being negotiated with VI Housing Finance Authority and the Department of Property and Procurement.

Dr. Deshona Williams Liburd Audain received a NIH AIM-AHEAD Hub Specific grant for over \$84,000. The grant provides funding to build a network of expertise within the biomedical and university domains and increase the training of medical professionals on Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning in the biomedical industry in the U.S. Virgin Islands.

Donations

The Master of Social Work Program received a \$10,000 donation from Celebrity Financial in support of scholarships for students pursuing degrees in MSW.

On October 10, 2023, the VI University Center for Excellence in Developmental Disabilities hosted a press release and photoshoot to celebrate a philanthropic donation from FirstBank in the amount of \$4,995. The donation provided direct funding for the Assistive Technology Re-Use Loan Program, which allowed VIUCEDD to purchase medical equipment for persons with mobility disabilities across the Territory. The Re-Use program provides a "loan closet" of assistive mobility devices, including wheelchairs, walkers, and canes, that can be borrowed for short or long-term periods.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

The UVI Music Program held their Charter Day Concert in the Prior Jollek Hall at the Antilles School. The concert was directed by **Dionne Donadelle** (UVI Concert Band), **Francis Callwood** (UVI Concert Choir), **Le'Roi Simmonds** (UVI Steel Pan Ensemble), and **Dion Parson** (UVI Jazz Combo).

The Virgin Islands Caribbean Cultural Center (VICCC) arranged and participated in meetings to discuss ongoing projects in the Virgin Islands, including digital archives and museums. Stakeholders included the Smith Center, the Emory Center for Digital Scholarship, the Virgin Islands Studies Collective, the National Museum of African American History, and private individuals.

Durin Fall, the Virgin Islands University Center for Excellence in Developmental Disabilities (VIUCEDD) offered nine (9) CEUs of training on Disability Employment Policies and Reasonable Accommodations, Aging in Place Training Series: Fall Prevention and Assistive Technology for the Bathroom, and the Florida Virgin Islands Deaf Blind Collaborative, all related to digital accessibility. Florida Virgin Islands Deaf Blind Collaborative, Disability Rights Center of the Virgin Islands, and the University of the Virgin Islands were among the partner agencies. Approximately 123 individuals in the community, including advocates, family members, and people with disabilities, were served.

The VIUCEDD participated in several community events in the U.S. Virgin Islands, including the UVI World Mental Health Festival in St. Thomas, and the WAPA Employee Wellness Day Fair in the St. Thomas/St. John and St. Croix districts, the 2nd Annual Virgin Islands Diabetes Center for Excellence Health Fair in St. Croix, and the White Cane Awareness Day Walk on St. Croix. These events allowed VIUCEDD to promote its services, disseminate information/promotional material, and demonstrate assistive technology devices for individuals with disabilities.

The Women's and Men's Basketball teams completed community service on November 22, 2023, when they assisted in Feeding Caribbean's "Hoops Against Hunger" initiative sponsored by the Ritz Carlton St. Thomas. They distributed food to unhoused and needy individuals in downtown Charlotte Amalie.

The 2023 World Food Day observance, co-sponsored by the V.I. Department of Agriculture, was held on Sunday, October 15 on the grounds of the AAS Campus. The theme, selected by the Food & Agriculture Organization (FAO) of the United Nations, was "Water is life, water is food. Leave no one behind."

The Cooperative Extension Services conducted three Basic Computer Training Courses from September through November 2023. The Basic Computer Training Course is designed to increase participants' knowledge and usage of computers. One of the goals of this course is to bridge the digital divide in the U.S. Virgin Islands.

The Agriculture and Natural Resources (ANR) Program conducted tours, field trips, and historical, cultural, natural, coastal, agricultural, environmental, and ethnobotanical presentations for students, parents, educators, summer programs, NGOs, private companies, faculty, students, and the public. Locations included East Salt River Bay National Historical Park & Ecological Preserve, Sion Farm and Estate Thomas, Annaly Bay, Caledonia Valley Tropical Moist Forest, Estate Windsor Forest, Caledonia Valley Tropical Moist Forest, and Estate Clairmont & Windsor Forest. There was a total of 174 attendees at these events.

The ANR Program collaborated with the Virgin Islands Department of Planning and Natural Resources by sharing local historical knowledge in workshops and town hall meetings on developing a Comprehensive Land & Water Use Plan.

The 4-H Healthy Habits Program engaged 246 4th graders enrolled in public schools to complete 8-plus hours of nutrition and healthy living programming.

The 2023 IGNITE by 4-H Lead 2 Change Project, “GROW It and Done!” achieved the following objectives: conducted training and orientation for five (5) community partners (24 youths and eight adults attended); a SOA student was a presenter on “Plants 101”; teen delegates presented their Lead 2 Change Project at World Food Day and presented five (5) community partners with token gardening boxes representing the official launch of “GROW It and Done!”

The 4-H Family and Consumer Sciences Program conducted four-holiday baking workshops on December 6 and December 7, featuring sweet bread and fruit cake at the Albert A. Sheen Campus, with approximately 25 adults and three youths in attendance.

Davis, Kenneth Olasee Presented to the St. Croix Rotary Club November 2023 on Hardships of Maroons in the Danish West Indies.

UVI School of Business faculty **Dr. Barbara Flemming** and **Dr. Nelso Pizarro** collaborated with Mr. Stanford Joines, representing the Rotary Mid-Isle organization on the annual Entrepreneurship Seminar event, which occurred on Friday, October 27, 2023, in EVC 401 (Little Theater) at the University of the Virgin Islands.

The Entrepreneurship Seminar began with an introduction by Mr. Stanford Joines, President, Rotary Mid-Isle. The remarks followed this and were welcomed by the School of Business Dean, **Dr. Kendra Harris**, and **Dr. Barbara Flemming**, Associate Professor of Management. Other presentations included different entrepreneurs located on St. Croix. They represented many businesses, including personal care, clothing and beverages, solar installation, photography and graphics, and pharmaceutical companies. Additionally, Governor Albert Bryan’s representative, Ms. Sana Joseph Smith, delivered the address on his behalf. **Dr. Nelson Pizarro**, the Kiril Sokoloff Distinguished Professor of Entrepreneurship and Innovation and Special Assistant to The President, gave the keynote address. Upon the conclusion of the lunch break, the university’s staff led a persuasive recruitment presentation that won the hearts of many high school students who attended this event. Overall, eighty (80) high school students participated in the seminar.

Janet Pointer, RN, **Kaylan Banjoko** (nursing student), and **Meah Moss** (nursing student) held a VIDO Blood Glucose event for sixty-three patients on December 1, 2023, at the Tutu Park Mall.

VI-EPSCoR hosted its third annual Ridge to Reef conference, *Communicating Science into Action*, on November 16-17, 2023. The conference focused on how to communicate scientific research into action. The conference showcased how data and science are shared and how that information can directly support natural resource management and policy development and indirectly inform local teachers as they inspire students toward STEM and environmental awareness. In attendance were 112 community participants, eight external advisory board members, and two external evaluators participants.

The Eastern Caribbean Center presented to the VI Department of Education Special Education teachers, administrators, support staff, students, and parents on the findings from the most recent Parent Satisfaction Survey. ECC has been measuring parental satisfaction of parents of students receiving special education services since 2007.

The Informal Learning (I.L.) Youth Engagement/STEM Enrichment Component of VI EPSCoR held the following Community Outreach events:

Community Engagement/Citizen Science

- Participation in the “International Day of Play”, an annual family-oriented event hosted by the Virgin Islands Children’s Museum (VICM). EPSCoR, in collaboration with the Virgin Islands Marine Advisory Service (VIMAS) and the DPNR Division of Fish & Wildlife, engaged 75 participants.
- Participation in the Governor’s Youth Workforce Development Summit in both districts. In total, 550 students across the Territory were engaged.

Youth/k-12 Outreach

- Worked with the St. Croix Career and Technical Education Center (CTEC) to integrate “Tiny Forests” lessons and concepts into a place-based curriculum used by the vocational school’s agricultural teacher. The launch of the first Tiny Forest at CTEC, in conjunction with several community partners, resulted in a total of 25 native/heritage trees being planted at CTEC.
- Coordinated two field trips for a Marine Biology teacher and her students to various sites, such as the VI Waste Management Authority Wastewater Treatment Facility and Southgate to learn first-hand about the industry's impact on St. Croix’s watersheds via desalination.

Suicide Awareness Day Pop-Up Event- In recognition of Suicide Prevention Week, Counseling Services held a Lunch & Learn Pop-Up Event on September 15, 2023. The presenters were Zulima Webster and Taylor Perry from the Department of Health, Division of Behavioral Health. Information was shared about suicides and the 988 Lifeline. Fifteen people participated.

Mental Health Awareness Training Program (MHAT)

Mental Health First Aid Training

Training Overview: MHFA is a course that teaches participants how to identify, understand and respond to signs of mental illnesses and substance use disorders. The training provides skills needed to reach out and provide initial help and support to someone who may be developing a mental health or substance use problem or experiencing a crisis.

- Patricia Towal and Dr. David Cannonier conducted a Blended Adult Mental Health First Aid training on Saturday, November 18, 2023, for UVI faculty, staff, and students. Twelve individuals attended.
- Dr. David Cannonier and Nurse Tabitha Urgent conducted a Blended Adult Mental Health First Aid training for the Virgin Islands community on Tuesday, November 21, 2023. Nineteen individuals attended.

Question, Persuade, and Refer Training

Course Overview: Persons trained in QPR learn how to recognize the warning signs of a suicide crisis and how to question, persuade, and refer someone to help.

- Twenty-eight people completed the QPR course and were certified. This included UVI staff, faculty, and students.

Outreach and Engagement Activities

- The MHAT program had a table at the Student Affairs World Mental Health Day event on October 10, 2023. The program provided attendees with information regarding the MHFA and QPR training, as well as information regarding stress and stress management.
- The MHAT program participated in Student Affairs at UVI's OEK campus Red Ribbon Week Event on October 24, 2023. The MHAT Program promotes the importance of living a drug-free and responsible drinking lifestyle.
- The MHAT program held its annual 7-in-7 Suicide Prevention Week event (Sept. 10th- September 16). Ten individuals completed the training during that week.

National Student Exchange Program

Incoming NSE Semester Events- The NSE Coordinator, Dahlia Stridiron-Felix, implemented the following activities for the NSE students.
