PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The President's Report for this reporting period is organized into two sections. 
This framework has been adopted to ensure that all Components and Departments across the University are focused on areas that the University has determined are critical to our future success. I continue to be extremely impressed with the productivity and commitment of our University's students, faculty, staff and administrators.

STUDENT ACHIEVEMNETS

- Wyndham Destinations, the world's largest timeshare company with one of its properties located in St. Thomas, awarded two \$10,000 Scholarships to **D'nique Potter** and **Rae'sheeda White**, first-year students enrolled in the Hospitality and Tourism Management Program at UVI. The award is to be retained by the University and applied against any future tuition payments the two students are required to make.
- Miss UVI, Jackeima Flemming, was crowned Miss National Black College Alumni (NBCA) Hall of Fame 2021-2022 on Saturday, November 13, 2021, in Atlanta, GA. Ms. Flemming competed among 19 other contestants from other Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) and is the third UVI queen to bring the coveted crown and title home. In vying for the NBCA Hall of Fame title, Ms. Flemming was judged in the following segments: personal interview; oratory, poise, and projection, which included the evening gown segment; talent and question and answer. To first qualify to participate in the Miss NBCA Hall of Fame Competition, Ms. Flemming captured the 2021-2022 crown as Miss University of the Virgin Islands after competing against three other contestants. Ms. Flemming was supported in Atlanta by eight UVI students, Student Affairs staff, and UVI alumni.
- UVI Communication students won nine awards in the 71st annual Southern Regional Press Institute
 journalism competition hosted by Savannah State University on February 25, 2022. Their entries were
 judged against news stories from programs such as Augusta State (Bell Ringer), Savannah State
 (Tiger's Roar), Bethune Cookman (BUC Voice), North Carolina Central (Campus Echo), and Georgia
 Highlands (Six Mile Post).
 - The awards were: Best Features Photography (First Place); Best News Package (Second Place); Best Mini Documentary (Second Place); Best Podcast or Internet-Streamed Show (First Place); Best Editorial/Opinion (Third Place); Best Features Story (Third Place); Best News Story (Second Place); Best Radio Drama (Third Place); and Best Radio Drama (Second Place).
- Kasem Thompson and Angelique Lettsome were crowned Homecoming King and Queen 2021-2022 at a gala event held in the UVI Sports and Fitness Center on November 7, 2021. The event was part of the 1st HBCU Basketball Classic.
- **George Francis** (Senior, Communication major) participated in the journalist competition sponsored by Black News Channel GO HBCU Journalism Project. The most recent submission was a newspaper

article which summarized "Virtual Media Day," a panel presentation that featured George's questions: Is there a future for Black journalism in America and what influence do Black journalists have upon the changing media landscape? The premier competition was designed for students to engage in networking opportunities with an on-air talent and will receive a paid internship in Summer 2022.

- Jane'e Joseph (panelist, Criminal Justice major), Eddie Gordon (panelist), and Kimarie Engerman (moderator) participated in the Gun Violence Awareness Campaign and Zoom Roundtable II sponsored by Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated on November 2, 2021.
- S'niyah Roberts, Junior and Communication major at UVI has become the third student for this academic school year to be selected to participate in the historic White House Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) Journalism Press Briefings. The events are part of a White House initiative to strategically position young black journalists and media enthusiasts in unique professional settings where they can engage with key political figures. The format is modeled after official press briefings held daily for the White House press corps.

PRESIDEENT'S APPRECIATION AWARD

During this critical period, the Accounting and Payroll Offices assumed responsibility for managing and implementing critical financial and payroll priorities. These activities were above and beyond the normal requirements of the Offices. These special Presidential initiatives included:

- Distributing funds to students under the Five Pillar Student Financial Support program. This program provided students with technology awards, the forgiveness of past due debt obligations, financial credits to students who paid on time, "compelling circumstances" grants and free housing for all residential students. Their efforts permitted students to receive millions of dollars in debt relief and financial support, and the entire financial aspect for the program was developed and implemented by the Accounting Office.
- Distributing the 8% Restoration Act Funds to all existing and former employees who qualified.
 In order to ensure that this occurred prior to Christmas, staff members from Accounting and Payroll worked during their holiday break.
- Distributing the 4% raise pool and retroactive pay to all employees.

These major projects would not have occurred without the support from Human Resources, the President's Office and other areas in the Administration and Finance component, yet we recognize the leadership, dedication and sacrifice of the Accounting and Payroll Offices under the strong leadership of Ms. Stacey Chados, Interim Controller. I am deeply appreciative of their efforts and sacrifices, and I am proud to present them with the Presidential Appreciation Award for this term.

Board Committee Items

Foundation for the University of the Virgin Islands – FUVI Board Member Nomination

The FUVI Board voted to recommend the nomination of **Dr. George Rosenberg** to serve as a member of the FUVI Board at its meeting held on Wednesday February 16, 2022. His name is being

submitted for review and approval by the UVI Board of Trustees. His CV was provided. A motion was made by Vice Chair Roebuck which was seconded by Trustee De Jongh to approve Dr. George Rosenberg to serve on the FUVI Board of Directors. The vote on the motion was unanimously approved.

ACADEMIC, RESEARCH, AND STUDENT AFFAIRS COMMITTEE..... Dr. JOHN A. QUELCH

Executive MBA Tuition Rate Increase

Dr. Kendra Harris, Dean of the School of Business, presented a proposal recommending an increase in the tuition and fees for the Executive MBA program. After some discussion, the committee voted unanimously to accept the recommendation to increase the tuition and fees for the Executive MBA program. The recommendation was forwarded to the full Board for review and action at the March 5th, 2022 meeting.

A motion was made by Trustee Callwood which was seconded by Vice Chair Roebuck to approve the Executive MBA rate increase. The vote on the motion was unanimously approved.

Associate of Applied Science in Agricultural Business

Dr. Usman Adamu, Dean of the School of Agriculture, presented a proposal for the Association of Applied Science in Agricultural Business degree program as approved by the faculty.

The program is designed to provide courses in the agricultural business industry. The program integrates business disciplines and other cultural business, economics, quantitative methods, and agricultural sciences. Students enrolled in the program will be prepared for careers in farm management, sales and marketing, international trade, agricultural processing, public relations, finance, and appraisal. A total of 65 to 66 credit hours are required to complete the degree program, including general education courses. 28 credit hours in required horticultural courses, and 9 to 11 credit hours of elective horticultural classes.

After some discussion, the ARSA Committee voted unanimously to accept the proposal for the Associate of Applied Science in Agricultural Business degree program. The recommendations was forwarded to the full Board for review and action at the March 5th, 2022 meeting.

Associate of Applied Science in General Agriculture

Dr. Usman Adamu, Dean of the School of Agriculture, presented a proposal for the Associate of Applied Science in General Agriculture degree program as approved by the faculty.

The program is designed to provide courses in a variety of agriculture-related positions. In addition, students will gain an understanding of key principles related to animal and plant science. A total of 63

to 64 credit hours are required to complete the degree program, including general education courses, 29 credit hours of required agroecology courses, and 6 credit hours of elective agroecology courses. After some discussion, the ARSA Committee voted unanimously to accept the proposal for the Associate of Applied Science in General Agriculture degree program. The recommendations will be forwarded to the full Board for review and action at the March 5th, 2022 meeting.

After both presentations, a motion was made by Trustee Callwood which was seconded by Trustee Vigilant to approve both the AAS in Agricultural Business and in AAS in General Agriculture.. The vote on the motion was unanimously approved.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE......Henry C. Smock Ratification of Action taken by the Executive Committee in Regular Session

Article VI, Section 1 (a) of the Bylaws of the University of the Virgin Islands states in part, "The Executive Committee may act for the Board between Board meetings, in the event of emergencies requiring Board action." That section of the Bylaws further states, "The Executive Committee shall report to the Board at its next meeting on all actions taken by it, and the Board shall ratify or revoke such actions. The Executive Committee approved the accept the Presidents Self-Assessment for FY2020-2021 and approved the presidential goals for 2021-22.

A resolution was presented to ratify the action of the Executive Committee regarding the matter.

A motion was made by Vice Chair Roebuck which was seconded by Trustee Habtes to approve President Hall's Self -Assessment and the Presidential goals. The vote on the motion was in favor with one abstention by Trustee Callwood.

FINANCE AND BUDET COMMITTEE.....ORAN C. ROEBUCK

FY2022 Operating Budget Revision Number One

The Finance and Budget Committee voted to recommend to the Board of Trustees the approval of the FY2022 Operating Budget Revision Number One with total operating revenues of \$51,448,718 and total expenditures and transfers of \$51,448,718.

A motion was made by Vice Chair Roebuck which was seconded by Trustee Callwood to approve FY2022 Operating Budget Revision Number One. The vote on the motion was unanimously approved.

Authorizing Submission of the FY2023 Appropriations Request from the Government of the Virgin Islands

The University is authorized to request a FY2022-2023 appropriation of \$44,325,553 to cover salaries, benefits, equipment, supplies, and incidental expenses of the University for its operations and programs.

A motion was made by Vice Chair Roebuck which was seconded by Trustee De Jongh to authorize Submission of the FY2023 Appropriations Request from the GVI. The vote on the motion was unanimously approved.
