




PERCENTAGE OF TUITION AND FEES TO OPERATING REVENUES

PERCENTAGE OF TUITION AND FEES TO OPERATING REVENUES PEER COMPARISON (GASB)









FEDERAL GOVERNMENT GRANTS AND CONTRACTS FY 2022 - PEER COMPARISON

- O Federal government grants and contracts (revenues): Revenues from federal governmental agencies that are for training programs, research, or public service activities for which expenditures are reimbursable under the terms of a government grant or contract. (GASB for public institutions)
- O Federal grants: Transfers of money or property from the Federal government to the education institution without a requirement to receive anything in return. These grants may take the form of grants to the institutions to undertake research, or they may be in the form of student financial aid, FASB (Financial Accounting Standards Board) for private, not-for-profit institutions or public institutions using FASB)


